HearthStone needs your help

HearthStone has helped hundreds in our community, now HearthStone needs your help. We are conducting our first ever fundraising drive. Simply put, we need financial help to keep HearthStone a vital force that can continue to help and support people with developmental disabilities in our lakeshore area. For instance, the Hearth-Stone Respite Care program uncovered the unmet needs for respite and has helped scores of families find much needed care-giving relief. But it costs HearthStone thousands of dollars a year. Fortunately, HearthStone recently received a \$4,000 grant from Sheboygan's Early Bird Rotary Foundation to help fund our Respite Program. More is needed however.

Hearthstone gives much to the community, now we need help, too. Historically, HearthStone has provided modest no interest loans that have enabled individuals and families to purchase their own home. We have helped with costly specialized care equipment. We hold quarterly educational meetings. And we provide social opportunities for our young people. All of these great efforts require funding, however, and our expenses are outstripping our current sources of income.

Benefits Seminar Recap

On September 16th about 30 people attended a special panel discussion on Working and Maintaining Benefits for the disabled, sponsored by RCS and Hearthstone. Our Panel included, Monica Froh, our local contact at the Aging Disability Resource Center, (ADRC). Monica is a Disability Benefits specialist for Sheboygan County. Anna Eggebrecht from Wisconsin State's Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, (DVR). Amber Molitor, a benefit counselor with Employment Resources, a federally funded program. These "experts" often work together to piece together the services and programs that someone has available so you stay eligible for benefits you may be getting or similar ones and still be able to work. They work with consumers to be sure they understand any requirements that need to be adhered to so they stay eligible and keep the proper departments informed. They talked about some more common problems that arise, often because of not understanding reporting requirements. Our experts spent over an hour fielding questions from the audience. The main message was to call and ask, if you want to work and you need your benefits, call and ask what you can do to do both. They have, what they called an "alphabet soup" of different programs that apply to different people and situations. If you have any questions the best place to start is locally, Monica would love to hear from you.
